


# **EDITORIAL**

Dear friends and fellow modellers,

Greetings from Bavaria's Nuremberg, our stall numbered B75 in Hall 7. That is our complete location where we can be found at the toy fair today, tomorrow and the day after, with the short exception of Friday between 1:30 and 3:30 in the afternoon. Between those hours, our entire contingent will be conducting our traditional press conference in the Stockholm room in the Service Centre North section. We invite everyone who attends the Nuremberg Toy Fair to come by and visit!

Our stall is this year decorated in the spirit of the seventies in keeping with the main attraction of our display, the 1/72 scale MiG-21MF. It's release is coming up fast, and it is slated for May 1st, an appropriate date for such an item. Nuremberg offers the first actual look at the plastic in person and is well worth it because, as we all know, no amount of CAD drawings, screenshots, Facebook posts or similar such modern little technical BS is any substitute for a little cuddle with freshly pressed plastic. In this case, the plastic is still nice ,n warm, as the first of these came off the machines immediately before departure to the fair. The plastic for other significant new items planned for 2018 are not yet being displayed, but their time will come at shows over the second half of the year. In all likelihood, the Bf 109G-10 will be introduced at Kit Salon Nymburk in Lysa nad Labem and will be available for purchase at the IPMS Nationals in Phoenix, Arizona. The Tempest will come at




E-day on September 28, 2018, also at Lysa nad Labem.

We do have some other fresh new releases with us to show in Nuremberg, starting off with the MERSU and the Spitfire HF Mk.VIII, which are new for February. You can read more about these items in this newsletter. Of course, we are not neglecting the newly tooled line of 48th scale Fw 190As, and besides the already released versions, we are preparing a new one, the two-cannon Fw 190A-5, for March. And while on the subject of March releases, another of our little gems can be viewed, this being the RIDERS IN THE SKY 1944 Limited Edition boxing dedicated to the Liberator GR Mk.III and GR Mk.V in Coastal Command RAF service from 1943 to 1945. The major part of the decal sheet and the accompanying publication will be dedicated to No.311 (Czechoslovak) Squadron, which will probably be easily forgiven by the home market. As a sidenote, a former radar operator from 1943 on on these aircraft, Mr. Kafka of said squadron, visited Eduard in January. A description of his visit and a little about the man himself is included in this newsletter along with the relevant introduction to the model kit being developed.

dellers, the press and retailers at shows is directed at model kits. Accessories, photoetched sets, masks and Brassins usually stay in their shadows despite being the most significant parts of our catalogue. This is because they tend to operate on a quantitative level, and it's rare for an aftermarket product to evoke the same level of intensive discussion. This year, we have no shortage of items in this category with two new lines of products that hold pretty high promise. The first of these are T-FACE masks that are applicable to both the outside and inside surfaces of clear parts and you can now try these out for yourselves as the first ones are being released for Revell's 1/32 scale Mustang. These have been available since January, but in the beginning were not labelled as such. The second line, although still in the pre-production development stage, shines by virtue of its potential to significantly raise the level of any model you set out to build. These will hit the market through the second quarter of the current year under the name EDU-ARD LOOK. And what exactly is this, you ask? It is a combination of current generation coloured steel seatbelts and coloured resin instrument panels. The belts are pre-painted, as noted, and weathered and the panels, besides also being pre-painted, have lenses over the instrument dials. The packages will typically include the instrument panel, easily installed in the model without the need of cutting, grinding or sanding, and a set of belts for which the same can be said. Both will be well visible in their appropriate kits, and both will substantially raise the standard of the model without major work and at a reasonable expense. What else can be offered? Well, at the moment, we are contemplating the inclusion of gunsights, so it appears that there is always the potential to

expand the horizon, no?

As promised, in January we raised the level of activity with respect to releases for the BFC. In February, this continues with the BFC MERSU which will include the well known postwar sharkmouthed G-6, and two publications (,The Boys are Back' and ,Aussie Eight', both in their second edition). There are some forthcoming decal sheets and a list of HGW Wet Transfers, this time for the Spitfire HF Mk.VIII. We decided to release a T-shirt to go along with the MERSU in co-operation with the firm Rezava Vrtule (The Rusty Propeller). And while on the topic of T-shirts, there is also one being readied for the RIDERS IN THE SKY.



# Lt.Col. Jiří Kafka in Eduard

On Wednesday, January 17, 2018, we were visited by a veteran from the 311th Czechoslovak Squadron RAF, Lt. Jiří Kafka, former radar operator and shooter at Liberators Coastal Command.

Lt. Kafka, who flew several hundred hours of operatic anti--submarine patrols between 1943 and 1945, got to England in 1939 as one of Winton's children.

The visit, organized by Mr. Stanislav Cerny, took place at the time of finalizing the Riders of the Sky 1944 project (Liberator GR Mk.III and Mk.V Coastal Command RAF). During the inspection of the construction and production areas of the company, Mr. Kafka of course was mostly interested in places where his "Liberator" was presented.

## Retired Colonel Jiří Pavel Kafka

was born on May 5, 1924, in Prague in Czechoslovakia. His family was of Jewish extraction, his father worked as a lawyer and was also the chairman of the Jewish community in Prague, his mother was a housewife. Jiří Pavel Kafka attended elementary school and later grammar school. Thanks to the providence of his father, Jiří and his siblings managed to travel to England on the so-called Winton train (June 28, 1939) shortly before the outbreak of the Second World War. In England, Jiří Pavel Kafka and his brother at first ended up in a camp for refugee -children in Ipswich. But later, thanks to his father, who fortuitously came to England and then worked as head of the Nečas ministry for economic recovery in the Beneš exile government, the two brothers got on a summer school and subsequently on a high school in Cheltenham. However, Jiří Pavel

Kafka grew tired of studying and thus he went into business, taking an apprentice at the company Sigmund Pumps. Then, on June 13, 1942, he resolved to join the army. For approximately three months, he served in the Czechoslovak land army, he completed basic training and then was accepted to the Royal Air Force (RAF). He attended training in Wales, Scotland and the Bahamas and was ranked as a gunner and radio operator in the 311th Fighting Wing, where he served between September 3, 1942 and September 19, 1945. His crew operated over the Bay of Biscay, the North Sea and the Atlantic. Their task was to accompany Allied convoys and destroy enemy ships and submarines. In 1945, he returned to Czechoslovakia where he found his mother, who had survived the Lodz ghetto, the Auschwitz concentration camp and then a camp in northern Bohemia. However, Jiří Pavel Kafka left Czechoslovakia again in 1947 and he went back to England. In 1949, he visited his native country for the funeral of his father, but didn't remain in the country permanently. In England, he lived with his brother and then they were joined by their mom. Jiří Pavel Kafka, together with a friend, founded a company for the import of components for the manufacture of jewelry. However, he became influenced by Zionism, and thus in 1960, he and his wife decided to move to Israel. In Israel, he became active in the real estate business, renting, buying and rebuilding houses. He continued to work in this field even after 1968, when he returned to England. In 1986, his mother died, followed by his wife in 1988, and so he decided to return to Czechoslovakia in 1990. Jiří Pavel Kafka currently lives in Prague.

## Bf 109G-6, MT-508, luutnantti (Lieutenant) Arvo Arima, HLeLv 31, Air Race, Utti, Finland, June 1950

Util air base had a mid-summer festival open day on June 23rd, 1950. It held an air show, to which participated a total of twelve Mersus, from both HLeLv 31 and HLeLv 33. It culminated at 7 pm to an American Reno style air race around the pole with four specially marked planes. MT-508 was plane B and at the controls was lutinantil Arvo Arima. He received the flying training in 1940-41 and flew as a reconnaissance pilot with LeLv 14 until demobilized on November 12th, 1944. In 1947-51 he enlisted again with HLeLv 31. Arima died on July 18th, 1977. The MT-508 also took part in the races; this aircraft was equipped with longer tailwheel leg. The camouflage of this aircraft is complemented by distinguishing marking in a form of blue and white squares forming a chessboard on the fuselage; there is a letter B on the fuselage and on top of the port wing, where it is accompanied by other white complements, which were also pointed on the left tail part. Regarding the fact that the racers flew in circles the

white complements, which were also painted on the left tail part. Regarding the fact that the racers flew in circles, the historians came to conclusion that the aircraft the racers flew were marked on the left side only.







# Fokker E.II

Fokker E.II, 68/15, flown by Lt. Brückmann, Armeeabteilung Gaede, Western Front, late 1915/ early 1916

This Fokker E.II 68/15 was destroyed on landing by Leutnant Brückman. Black and white stripes place this aircraft in the services of Armeeabteilung Gaede on the Alsasian Front. The black rudder was likely a marking of Kampfeindeker Halbabteilung FFA9b. From this unit came KEK Ensisheim, the base unit for the future Jasta 16.





# Fokker E.II 69/15, flown by Lt. K. von Crailsheim, Feldfliegerabteilung 53, Western Front, October 1915

The road to the air force was typical for Leutnant Kurt von Crailsheim. After being wounded with Infanterie-Regiment Nr. 120 (2.Württembergisches), he was deemed unfit for further field duty, and was transferred to the air force. After passing flight training, he joined the ranks of FFA 53 as a pilot, where he downed a french Voisin of VB114 on September 22nd, 1915. In October, he began flight duty with the Fokker E.II 69/15. According to some sources, it was in this aircraft that he suffered a forced landing on December 12th, 1915, succumbing to his wounds on January 4th, 1916.


















#### Bf 109G-14/U4, Hptm. Erich Hartmann, 4./ JG 52, Csór, Hungary, October 1944

Erich Hartmann, the most successful fighter plane pilot of all times, first joined the 7. Staffel of JG 52 on October 10th, 1942. He remained with Jagdgeschwader 52 till the end of World War Two; in fact he became the commander of its I. Gruppe. The total count of his shot down aircraft was 352. For his exceptional success he was awarded the Knight's Cross of the Iron Cross with Oak Leaves, Swords and Diamonds. After WWII he was transferred to the POW camp in the Ural Mountains in Soviet Union and was not released until 1955. The following year he joined the ranks of Western German Luftwaffe. He became the commander of JG 71, the first fighter plane Luftwaffe squadron equipped with jet-powered fighter aircraft. He retired in 1970 and died on September 20th, 1993.

Standard camouflage of Hartmann's "white 1" Luftwaffe fighter plane was complemented by black tulip with white outline situated at the nose of the aircraft; this was in the time of his command of 4. Staffel. On the left side, underneath the cockpit, there was a heart with Hartmann's wife's name written over it. The yellow bottom parts of the wing tip and the yellow stripe around the back part of the fuselage marked the aircraft serving on the Eastern Front. The photograph of the nose of this aircraft shows that the engine cover is identical to those produced in Erla factory in Leipzig.























#### Bf 109G-14, W. Nr. 464534, EJG 2, Pilsen, Czechoslovakia, May 1945

This Bf 109G-14 is one of the planes found at Pilsen Airfield after WWII. The pilot of the plane is not really known. Underneath the last marking the marking of the last user could clearly be seen. The symbol on the aircraft's nose belonged to KG 55. This squadron, originally a bombing squadron, flew until September 1944 with two-engine He 111 planes. In 1944, rather than the bombing squadrons, the situation at the battlefields required fighter plane squadrons. So, three KG 55 Gruppes were remarked to KG(J) 55 and instead of Heinkels they were supposed to get jet-powered Me 262s. These aircraft never reached the squadron, though; the pilots had to be content with Bf 109Gs and Fw 190As. Pilsen was just a location of the IV. Gruppe; this squadron was later transferred under Erg. KGr (J). In January there was a change in marking to I./EKG(J) and in March 1945, remarking to 5. /EJG 2. Its 19. Staffel (originally 4./EKG(J)) remained in Pilsen till the end of WWII.

The aircraft bears a camouflage scheme of Erla factory from Leipzig. This scheme was mostly used with previous variants of Bf 109G, the scheme is characterized by sinuous transition between RLM 74 and RLM 75 colours used on the wings. There is a chance that the rudder, originally painted yellow, was repainted with one of the camouflage colours. The KG 55 symbol (mythical griffin bird on the escutcheon) is placed onto this aircraft without a coloured base









After the declaration of Italian Social Republic on September 18th, 1943, a puppet state on the territory of Italy, occupied by Germany allowed this military under the command of Benito Mussolini, Germany allowed this Republic to establish its own military force of four divisions. Its air force component called Aeronautica Nazionale Repubblicana consisted of two fighter plane groups (Gruppo Caccia), torpedo groups (Gruppo Aerosiluranti Buscaglia) and several transportation squadrons. In 1945, both fighter plane squadrons flew Messerschmitts Bf 109G-6/G-10/G-14. The commander of 5a Squadriglia, called Diavoli Rossi, was Maggiore Mario Bellagambi, a fighter ace with 14 shot downs. After WWII, in 1949, he was, once again, admitted to Italian air force where he, prior to his retirement, became a Generale di brigata aerea. He died in Florence on June 25th, 2001.

Bellagambi's 109 is camouflaged with RLM 74/75/76 colours, the sides of the fuselage are very likely darkened with Italian Verde Oliva Scuro 2 colour. The same colour is applied to the stain underneath the red devil, the emblem of 5a squadriglia. The rudder, supplied by one of the subcontractors, bears a camouflage painted in RLM 81 and 82. It is probable that the bottom engine part was yellow or repainted by RLM 76. The yellow lining of fuselage marking of the ANR aircraft is, compared to other aircraft, reversed or bears yellow triangles around the flag.






